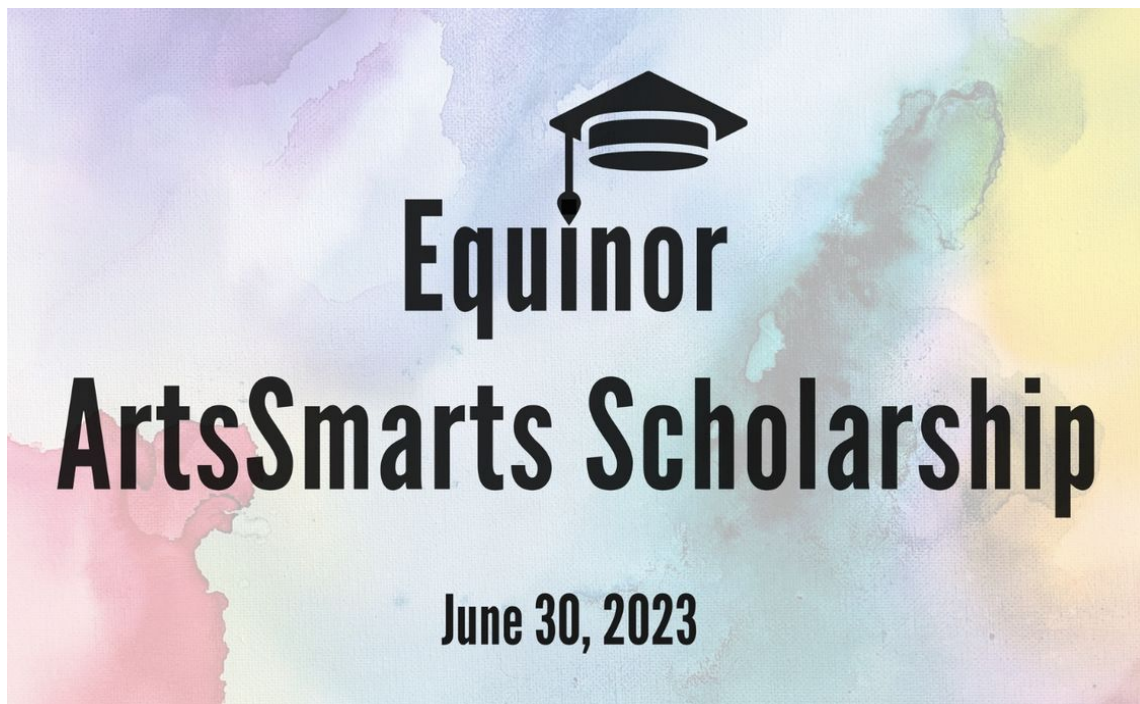
Opportunity for Artists and Creators

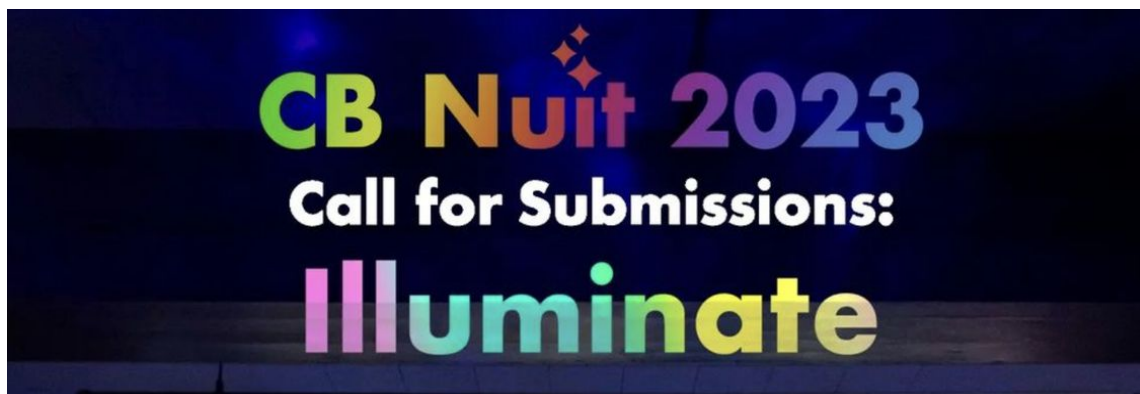
The first Request for Proposals for artwork focuses on three large 3D works.

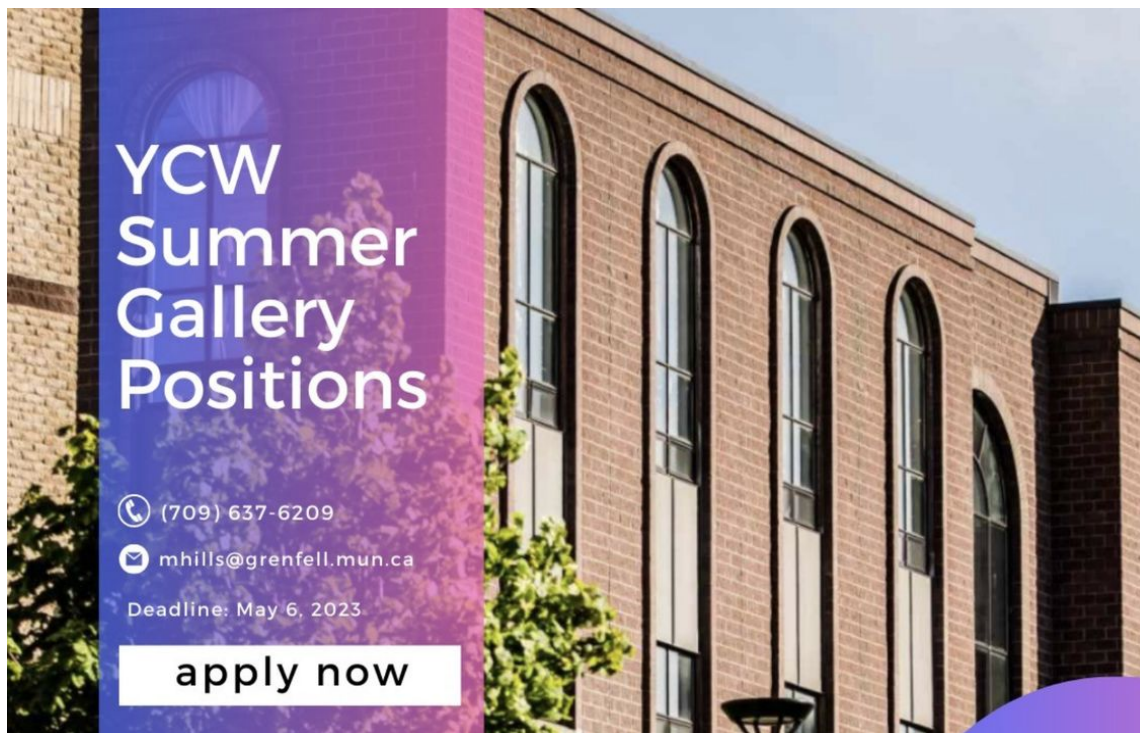

CEBA Loan Status for Non Profit Arts in Canada

Ross Creek Centre for the Arts is working with colleagues across the country to launch a federal campaign to eliminate the CEBA loan repayments for non profit arts organizations across Canada (in time for the fall 2023 fiscal update) and need help to gather information.

Could [you pass on this poll](#) to your colleagues and share it widely across the country to other arts coalitions, umbrella arts and culture organizations, and anyone else appropriate?

It will let us know who took out the CEBA loan, what federal riding they are in, and if they want to say any impact it would have on them to have to repay the whole thing vs. it being forgiven in whole that would be really helpful. That way we can create tools for arts orgs to message their MPs (from all sides) and start to rebuild that national voice for the arts.

No organization will be identified unless express permission has been given, but we need the information to make a solid case for forgiveness before the period comes up.

In NS, the case is already clear that many of us haven't begun to pay the loans back, and that it poses a significant hardship as we continue to recover without any of the support systems which were in place earlier in the pandemic.
