# **CALLS**





St. Michael's Printshop invites applications from artists residing in the province with basic knowledge of at least one print medium who wish to come and work at the printshop for a one to three month period. A total of two local visiting artist residencies are offered during the year. Artists who are experimenting with their printmaking practice and/or artists in earlier stages of their careers will be prioritized.


Artists are paid a residency fee of \$1500 and given full access to St. Michael's Printshop for a one to three month period. In return, artists offer one community engagement

Each year, St. Michael's Printshop offers one emerging artist the Don Wright Printmaking Scholarship (DWS), to one emerging artist. The focus of the scholarship is to provide year-long access to the printshop for an emerging artist, as well as learning opportunities through mentorship and access to classes offered at the studio.

The scholarship is designed to allow the scholar space, support and dedicated time to develop their practice. The DWS includes 24 hour access to the shop for one year, a stipend of \$1500, introduction to an awesome arts community and an event, or workshop, and supply two prints from each edition created during the residency to SMP. exhibition in our gallery at the end of the residency.




Planning on going to the ECMAs? You can now apply for funding through MusicNL's Professional Development Program! Deadline to apply is April 21, 2024.

Artist Residencies: Call for Artists | Apply by: April 15, 2024

The Sustainable Nunatsiavut Futures project is seeking 5 artists to participate in residencies to support learning and community building around protecting Inuit interests in Nunatsiavut.

Compensation: Each artist will receive a \$2500 stipend for their participation in the residency (a 4-week commitment). Artists will also receive up to \$500 each for materials.

- The SNF Artist Residencies aim to support Inuit artists from Nunatsiavut to create works related to the themes or research outcomes and process of the SNF research project.
- The residencies will be one month each and take place between July and November of 2024, the specific timing will be determined with individual artists in residence.
- Artists will have the option to access studio space at The Rooms in St.
  John's (subject to approval/conditions outlined by The Rooms) or are
  welcome to remain in community.
- For artists who choose to remain in their communities, funds for childcare will be made available.
- Those who choose to travel to St. John's will receive additional funds to cover travel. Accommodation will be supported up to a certain amount (see FAQs).

Mabe Kyle is working on a national anthology of Rural Queer Stories in

partnership with Caitlin Press. They are creating an anthology on rural 2SLGBTQIA+ lives and stories. They are looking for nonfiction prose and poetry. They want you to write about your lived experience as a rural 2SLGBTQIA+ person. Maybe you grew up on a farm, currently live on a reserve, or spent some time living in a small town. Maybe your story is full of hardship, joy or humour. They want to hear from you and celebrate you in your full authenticity.

Submit works of original stories of nonfiction prose and poetry and essays up to 3,000 words written by 2SLGBTQIA+ people who have lived experience in rural, remote, and reserve communities. Contributors may be Indigenous, refugees, permanent residents or citizens of what is colonially known as Canada. Include your name, pseudonym, pronouns, address, phone number and email in your submission as well as an up-to-date bio (approximately 200 words in length).

# Call for Proposals for Outdoor Artworks: Call and Response Canadian Heritage

The Art in the Capital Program, managed by Canadian Heritage, aims to raise the profile of Canadian public art in the urban spaces of Canada's Capital Region. Canadian Heritage is seeking dynamic, impactful images that convey the theme "Call and Response."

This Call for Proposals is open to Canadian visual artists, photographers, graphic designers, and illustrators between the ages of 18 and 39. This competition is intended to provide opportunities to young artists, including students, emerging artists and those entering mid-career.

Four artworks will be chosen by a selection committee to be reproduced on exterior-quality graphic film and installed on stairs at four prominent locations in downtown Ottawa for a one-year period starting in spring 2024. Artists may submit a maximum of two proposals in total, either both for the same location, or for two different locations.

The winning artist for each staircase will receive a fee of \$5,000 for the exhibition of their artwork.


**Untellable Movement Theatre – Artist Residency Program**

Dr. Phillips was the subject of our play Oil and Water, and we are delighted to honour his legacy with this award.


